About Institute

The Regional Institute of English (RIE) was established in 1963 under a scheme of the Government of India to address the educational needs of Chandigarh, Jammu & Kashmir, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and Punjab. The functioning of the Institute is within the purview of the Chandigarh Administration. The Institute has been working and collaborating with the English and Foreign Languages University (EFL-U), Hyderabad and with state governments in the northern region, CBSE, Panjab University, NCERT, USIEF, British Council and RELO, American Centre, New Delhi in various research projects and teacher training programmes. In 2016, Institute was accredited with NAAC both for MA English and Teacher Education programmes. Presently the Institute is also covered under RUSA and has conducted many RUSA sponsored courses and workshops.

Since its inception, it has been catering to Educational needs of the region from Primary to Postgraduate level by organizing various need based programmes. It is a pioneer institute in using multimedia for teaching English language. More than 10,000 teachers have benefitted from the various courses in the last ten years. In the past, RIE has conducted courses for International scholars also, AUSEP being the most recent one. Afghan University Student Exchange Programme (AUSEP), a four-week teacher education course in ELT for Afghan undergraduates/graduates conducted in collaboration with American Centre for four consecutive years i.e. 2011-2014.

RIE is currently running many courses each with a different set of target group i.e. catering to English language needs of people at diverse levels. It runs MA English, Postgraduate Certificate in the Teaching of English (PGCTE), a 120-hour course in Personal Development for students of UT Administration colleges, one new department was introduced in the session 2016-17 called Department of Continuous Professional

Regular Courses

a. Postgraduate Certificate in the Teaching of English (PGCTE)

113 PGCTE Batch

113, 20 Weeks Postgraduate Certificate Course in the Teaching of English (PGCTE), a Teacher-Training Course which commenced on 13 July 2020 and concludes on 27 November 2020. The Course is to be done online from the place of work or residence due to COVID-19. The Course has been hosted on Edmodo platform. There are forty-seven participants enrolled for the course. The institute is conducting 113 PGCTE Course purely online. The nature of the Course will be totally asynchronous. The participants (In-Service teachers and Private candidates) are not instructed to ask for relieving orders from their workplace as the course can be completed as per their convenience and even on weekends. The total timeline of the entire course is twenty weeks. These weeks have been segmented into cluster weeks. Each cluster weeks dedicate itself to a given paper. The focus areas of the course are benefits of online teaching/virtual classroom, methodology, material production, linguistics, phonetics, teaching of grammar, project work, lesson planning and teaching practice. The online course is holistic and comprehensive in nature as it caters to all emerging needs and developments for teachers. From technology and conducting online sessions to various trends in methodology and material production, the course offers unique scope and outcome.

The course also ensured offering understanding of technology and its aspects, grammar dynamics and its various components, phonetics scope and linguistics universal appeal. One of the most interesting component of the course is preparing a project under the guidance of an allocated supervisor. The project will deal with current developments in English language teaching.

The 20 weeks timeline will necessitate a full dedication from the teachers. In approximately 20 weeks the teachers will experience lot of new things on this platform specially in context of professional development of in service teachers and would be teachers.

The batch consists of participants from various parts of India. This time the course is being run even for those participants who are not necessarily from north India. This has become possible due to launch of online course which is free of spatial constraints. Moreover it has enlarged the scope of this course making it Pan India in appeal and scope.

The course is primarily an asynchronous course, meaning the participants have liberty to submit assignments anytime within a week but before beginning of next week. The institute has also planned live sessions on Google meet and zoom. The asynchronous nature of the course has been planned keeping in mind the prior engagements of in service teachers. The course plans to do justice to in service as well as to would be teachers.

During this week following topics were covered:

Concurrently in week one the participants were trained in the dynamics of teaching online and understanding the virtual classroom by Dr Gopal and Jyoti. This is continued in second week also that is from 18 July to 24 July 2020. Following topics were covered in cluster weeks dedicated to technology.

2. In the next three weeks Ms Namrata Parmar trained participants in Methodology of English Teaching and English for Specific Purposes. (Week 3,4 and 5) from 27 July – 14 August 2020. Following topics were covered during these cluster weeks.

3. The next three weeks were dedicated to Material Production. Material Production was taken up by Dr Gopal Nayak. (Week 6, 7 and 8) from 17 August -4 September 2020. Following topics were covered leading to material production.

3	Making new materials
4	Online resources

4. This particular week was dedicated to Phonetics. Phonetics was taken up by DRIE in Week 9 from 7 September -11 September 2020. Following topics were covered during this week.

1	Vowels

5. Week ten and eleven were dedicated to Grammar by Dr Jyoti Singh from 14 September to 25 September 2020.

6. In week twelve and thirteen Ms Namrata Parmar trained participants in linguistics from 28 September to 9 October 2020. Following topics were covered during this week.

1	Morphology
2	Word Formation

7. The participants were oriented to project work in week fourteen. In the following weeks the participants were given a sample project work. Seven groups were formed for project work. Each group consists of five members. The topics have also been allocated to seven groups. The deadline for submission of project work is 7 November 2020. Following are the project work topics:

1. Group 1- Best Classroom practices in context of secondary and senior secondary education system.
2. Group 2- Role of hygiene and food in improving educational outcomes.
3. Group 3- Root word of the day in context of Punjab.
4. Group 4- Impact of e-learning on the academic performance of the students.
5. Group 5- Causes of poor academic performance by secondary and senior secondary students.
6. Group 6- Critical causes of mass failure in English at various levels.
7. Group 7- Importance of quality teacher training for positive learning outcomes.

8. The teaching practice depending on the situation has been planned at schools 6 (Lesson plans signed by a peer supervisor and certificate of completion by Principal) or the participants will be required to

execute lesson plan through virtual classroom. Ms Namrata Parmar will facilitate the lesson making and presentation in the following weeks.

9. Checking of project, feedback on project and evaluation will be done thoroughly.

10. Lesson plans will be checked thoroughly.

Since 113 PGCTE was hosted on Edmodo following observations have been made. There are countless benefits of using Edmodo in classroom;

1. Home - School Connections.

The participants are able to access their Edmodo accounts from school and from home. This allows them to prepare for upcoming events, tasks or assignments when working through their homework. It also allows them to communicate with their teacher (directly) or ask questions of their peers (on the public wall) when working through tasks at home.

2. Resources That Can Be Shared.

It is possible to share a range of resources with participants on Edmodo. These include websites, embedded YouTube clips, files, documents and images. This is fantastic as it means we are saving paper and a teacher is showing participants a solid range of resources without them needing to 'google' something.

3. Feedback.

Having an Edmodo page allows to give immediate feedback to participants. For example: replying to their posts asking them to edit certain parts or expand on others. This immediate feedback keeps participants remain on task and it is quick and easy.

4. Safe – Well Knit Network.

Edmodo groups can be locked once all students have joined the group. In fact, they are automatically locked after a few weeks. If new students come or you want to add someone to the group, one can simply unlock it, give them the secure code and lock it again. Another reason it is safe is due to students only being able to communicate with their peers on the page wall. This means that conversations are viewable to all and therefore must be appropriate. If students need to communicate with the teacher, they are able to send a direct message, which is only viewable to those involved.

5. Virtual Enriching Experience

Edmodo classes truly are a virtual base camp for participants. At the moment we have one participant in Punjab, another in Haryana and one in West Bengal. These participants are still completing all of their learning, but through our virtual classroom. Also participants who have been absent have continued to work through their guided reading tasks with their groups. This includes them reading the modules, completing their activity, saving it as PDF and sending it through on Edmodo.

6. Participants Independence.

This builds independence in participants as they are responsible for doing the work. It's a great skill for them to learn, especially in such a safe environment.

7. Edmodo Communities.

The communities that you can join as an educator are fantastic. They work as an open discussion forum where teachers can share resources, ask / answer questions and learn from colleagues. There are so many you can follow.

8. Parent Access.

When a participant joins Edmodo they are given a parent code. This can be found on the bottom left hand side of the student page. The parent then needs to go to www.edmodo.com and click on the 'I'm a Parent' tab. This allows them to see what their child sees, as well as the grade book .

9. Calendar / Planner.

Edmodo platform offers best use of calendar and planner. This way we can plan our activities and participants can also follow the guidelines.

10. Alerts / Reminders for participants.

There is also an option for reminder in Edmodo which helps learners to adhere to calendar schedule.

11. Online Polls and Quizzes.

Edmodo allows you to set polls for students. It is really effective when we have to start a new topic or get some feedback on a new resource. The results are displayed on the Edmodo wall as people post them, without any names being mentioned. The quizzes are another great tool and can be used widely. The teacher simply creates a quiz using multiple choice, true / false, short answer, fill the blank and / or matching questions.

12. Assignments.

Similar to the quizzes above, assignments can also be posted to students. In this you can give them an outline of what needs to be completed, attach resources / rubrics and set a due date. When completed, students can submit online.

13. Small Groups Within Groups.

One can create small groups within each of groups. This allows to scaffold tasks, modify or extend tasks and personalise learning for students. It's also great for group tasks.

14. Student or Read-Only Options.

The admin / teacher of each group is able to edit members. This means that you can set participants as a student, which means they can post of the wall, or you can set them to a read only option. This means they are still able to see what is posted on the wall but unable to comment. You can easily change between the two.

15. Grade Book.

Any quizzes or assignments set for students can be marked on Edmodo and their marks put into a personal grade book. Students get an instant message informing them of their mark as well as any comments. Parents also have access to the grade books when they log on with their parent code.

16. 21st Century Education.

In today's day and age we are encouraging the idea of 21st century learning. Edmodo is a safe environment where both students and teachers can **Postgraduate Certificate in the Teaching of English (PGCTE)**

a. MA (English)

RIE is the first institute of its kind that offers utmost flexibility to its MA students in academic choices. We are also the only institute offering Linguistics as a primary subject and not just as an optional choice. In MA Semester III there are total 13 students.

b. CPD (ST)
